Strengthening Families Together

Strengthening Families Together is an 8-week psychoeducational group developed by the BC Schizophrenia Society. It was developed with the belief that Canadian families have a right to reliable educational information on serious mental illnesses.

The 8-session education program for family members and friends of individuals with serious and persistent mental illnesses aims to increase accessibility to Canadian-based information on topics associated with living with mental illness. This program will be co-led by VCH Family Coordinator Jessica Wilkins and a family member.

Topics include:

- Information on mental illnesses:
- Treatment including information on medication;
- Understanding the mental health system;
- Addiction;
- Coping as a family;
- Advocacy.

VCH will be offering the Strengthening Families Together program twice per year, the next session begins in May 2014.

Current Research on Schizophrenia, Dr. Bill Honer

One of the keynote speakers for our Family Conference on April 26 will be Dr. Bill Honer. To whet your appetite, here is some information about him.

Dr. Honer is a Professor and Head of the UBC Department of Psychiatry and the Jack Bell Chair in Schizophrenia, as well as the Scientific Director of the BC Mental Health & Addiction Research Institute.

He has been a leader in schizophrenia research for many years. For example, he has studied brain structure and treatment response in persons with first episode schizophrenia as well as to those who do not respond well to treatment. The contribution of genetics, development and experience to the



onset of schizophrenia is one of his areas of interest. He leads the research area of the UBC Schizophrenia Program which looks at psychosis from a wide perspective, including proteomics (biological measures of schizophrenia), pharmacology (medication), brain imaging, genetics, cognition (mental processing) and social functioning. Dr. Honer also works to find optimal ways to translate research into clinical practice.

Currently, Dr. Honer is the primary investigator in a study of the mental health of 500 formerly homeless people who live in supportive housing. This is an Urban Psychiatry research project that involves comprehensive care for serious mental illness and addiction ("SAMI") complicated by physical health issues.

Dr. Honer has authored the assessment section of the Canadian Clinic Practice Guidelines for Schizophrenia. He also won an award for mentoring UBC Faculty of Medicine members who are early in their career.

Spotlight On: Dr. Evan Wood

Dr. Evan Wood will be a Keynote Speaker at the upcoming 9th Annual Family Conference, Family Involvement in the Mental Health and Addiction System.

Evan Wood, MD, PhD, ABIM, FRCPC, is Professor of Medicine at the University of British Columbia and an attending physician on the Clinical Teaching Unit at St. Paul's Hospital, where he is also the co-Director of the Urban Health Research Initiative. Dr. Wood is the Medical Director for Addiction Services at Vancouver Coastal Health and was the Founding Director of the St. Paul's Hospital Goldcorp Fellowship in Addiction Medicine, Western Canada's only American Board of Addiction Medicine accredited training program for addiction medicine physicians. Dr. Wood's current clinical practice and research are dedicated to inner city medicine issues, with a particular focus on improving early intervention in alcohol and drug addiction.



Dr. Wood has published over 350 scientific papers and has explored diverse areas of research including addiction, mental illness, and improving early intervention initiatives.

At his presentation at the Family Conference on April 26th, Dr. Wood's presentation will explore addiction as a health issue, and explore the effect of drugs on brain and behaviour, as well as concurrent disorders.

Dr. Wood will be speaking at the 9th Annual Family Conference, 26 April 2014. His presentation is titled, "Mobilizing Families and Communities to Improve Care for People with Addiction".
