

Client Satisfaction Surveys



Our Peer Education Meetings continue to attract 5 to 15 currently employed Peer Support Workers interested in professional development at each monthly online meeting.

The shift from paper record-keeping to electronic records kept by PSWs began this year. PSWs from seven sites now have VCH email accounts and will receive training in electronic records management next year.

The Peer Work Network featured a variety of topics in this last year, attracting Peers Workers from all parts of BC. Participation in its online meetings ranged from 7 to 20 individuals each month.
